COALS OF FIRE

This devotional corresponds with the Alternative Fuels Honor.

"Therefore if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him a drink; for in so doing you will heap coals of fire on his head." (Romans 12:20, NKJV)

"We may never know until the judgment the influence of a kind considerate course of action to the inconsistent, the unreasonable, and unworthy. If, after a course of provocation and injustice on their part, you treat them as you would an innocent person, you even take pains to show them special acts of kindness, then you have acted the part of a Christian..." (Medical Ministry, p. 209–210)



Today's thoughts are perhaps among the most difficult for any of us to accept, much less put into practice. When someone wrongs us, it is only natural (and logical) to feel the impulse to retaliate in one form or another. "Fight fire with fire!" we may want to say. We live in a society where bullies abound (and not just in school). we must eitherOur natural instincts iscan be to withdraw, or lash out and strike back.

However, all we accomplish by doing that is adding fuel to the fire. But there is an alternative fuel available—God's fuel. Romans 12:19 is very clear about it: "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay, says the Lord."

These verses in Romans point back to an incident in Israel's history. We can read about it in 2 Kings 6:8–23. The Syrians had invaded Israel and were causing serious problems for God's people, but God chose to pull a joke on them by causing them to go blind. Elisha then guided these blinded Syrians to Samaria, the capital, and walked them right into the main plaza in the center of the city. Then God gave them their eyesight back—just in time for them to see they were completely surrounded by Israelite soldiers!

The Israelite king's first impulse was to take revenge on the Syrians and attack them. So he asked Elisha, "My father, shall I kill them? Shall I kill them?" I can imagine he had already drawn his sword and

his soldiers had done the same, waiting for his command. (At least they were waiting for Elisha's final word, respecting that it was he who had brought their enemies to them in the first place.)

But what was Elisha's answer? He wanted them to use an alternative fuel instead. 2 Kings 6:22 tells us what he said: "You shall not kill them...Set food and water before them, that they may eat and drink and go to their master." Then what did Elisha himself do? Verse 23 says: "Then He prepared a great feast for them; and after they ate and drank, he sent them away and they went to their master [the king of Syria]." And what was the end result of Elisha's orders? The verse and chapter concludes, "So the bands of Syrian raiders, came no more into the land of Israel." Wow!

Now this story doesn't mean that every time you use this "alternative fuel," you're automatically going to get amazing results right away. You see, as humans we have conditioned ourselves to prefer instant gratification instead of long-term. We want everything right now. God does do things in His own time, but His actions are effective and final nevertheless. You've seen what our other quote above says, right? "We may never know until the judgment..." That is why we also read in James 1:2, 3: "Count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience." So, while using this alternative fuel isn't easy, in the end it is totally worth the effort.
